






Human Rabies in the Philippines

- Rabies a public health concern
- Responsible for the death of at least 200 Filipinos annualy
- One of the priority diseases of DOH

- 2014:

234 Probable cases of human rabies:

- 96%: dog bites


- 4%: cat bites

683,302 Rabies Exposures

- Increasing in past 10 years
 - 79% Dog bites, 19% cat bites
 - 45% Children ≤ 15 years of age
 - 174 Private and 485
 Government bite centers



Disease Free Zone Initiative



2005: One of 5 disease for elimination

2007: Proposal to control and eliminate human rabies in the Visayas

2009- 2013: Implemented in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture and Local Government Units of Visayas the WHO-BM Gates Foundation supported dog v vaccination project

Phase1

- Western Visayas and
- Central Visayas (Siquijor and Negros Oriental)

Year 1(2009- 2010): Social preparation

Year 2(2010): Start of Vaccination

Phase II

- Central Visayas (Cebu) and Eastern Visayas

Year 1 (2009): No support

Year 2 (2010) - Social Preparation

Year 3 (2011) Start of Dog Vaccination



Result





Figure 3. Clinically Diagnosed Human Rabies, Visayas Regions, 2009-2013



Priority:

- Improve Dog vaccination coverage 8241 volunteers
- Improve access to PEP:
 - 58 to 120 bite treatment centers
 - 66,180 to 131,653 rabies exposures

Rabies Free Zones:

- 3 island provinces
- 5 island municipalities
- 5 smaller island


Human Rabies

- 343 cities/municipalities with no case
- 19 reported cases in the past 2 years, mostly in Regions 6 and 8


Typhoon Yolanda(Haiyan) in 2013

- Massive destruction
- Dog vaccination severely affected in Regions 6 and 8 for almost 2 years
- Significant increase in reported cases of rabies in 2014 in Region 6 and 8
- Catch up vaccination in 2015 with dog vaccine support from "Haiyan funds " of WHO- Country Office the time is

Philippine Health Sector Roadmap 2014 to 2016



- Package of actions and population coverage:
- Treat all diagnosed TB cases
- Eliminate malaria in endemic provinces
- Improve HIV/AIDS prevention, screening, diagnosis, and treatment
- Eliminate rabies by Providing rabies vaccine for dog bite victims and coordinate with DA for dog vaccination
- Eliminate filaria and other intestinal parasites
